President Scott welcomed Todd Lilly as our newest club member.

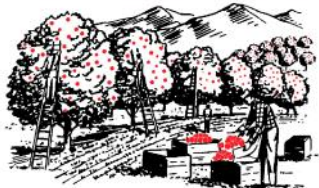
Service Learning Workshop with Dr. Drew Stelljes

Born and raised in Parkersburg, WV, Debbie is a graduate of Marshall University. After college, she set out for the big city of Charlotte, NC, where she began a career in banking, and met her future husband.

When her second child was born, she left her job with BB&T to stay at home. She then became involved with a business opportunity that allowed her to work from home. This was a billboard company, which now has 100 boards between VA, WV, and NC.

Debbie is the mother of three. Her oldest is a graduate of Virginia Tech, and is now a Physician's Assistant in Savannah, GA. Her middle child is graduating from Liberty University, and her youngest is at VMI.

Ridge White: Ridge is keeping up a family tradition by becoming a Rotarian. His grandfather, father, and uncles were all presidents of our club.
